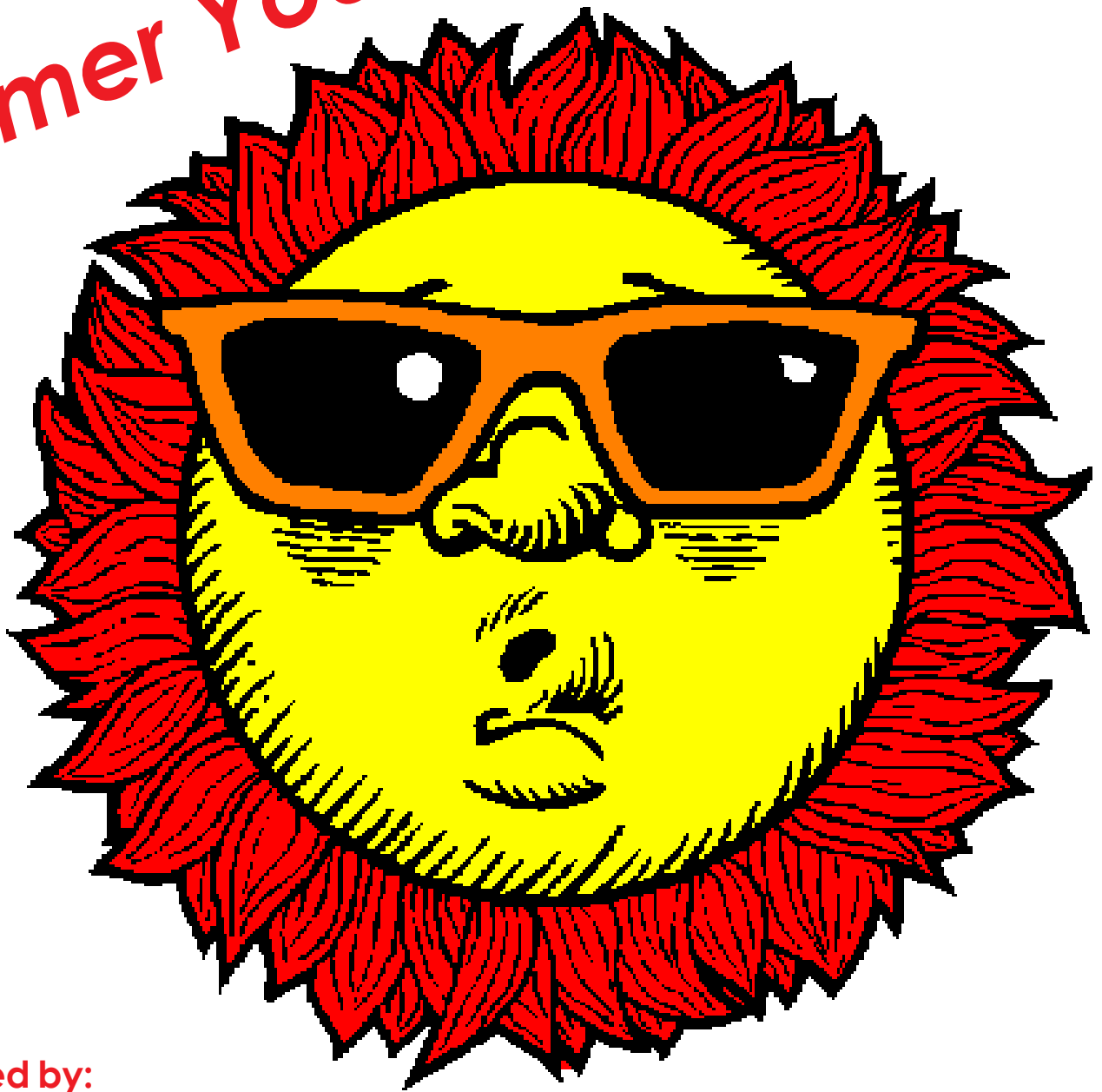

After the Bell Rings Summer Day Camp

The Community Education Department of the Saginaw Public Schools is offering an After the Bell Rings Summer Day Camp. The camp is an extension of the After the Bell Rings Program currently offered after school. Activities will include, but are not limited to, arts & crafts, board games, dramatic play, language/arts/writing, puzzles, field trips, videos, outdoor activities as well as quiet time. The focus of our activities will be "educational fun".

This summer childcare program is available to all school age children (ages 4-12). It is available to those with parents working outside the home or those who would simply enjoy being involved with the activities the program provides. The ATB Summer Day Camp program will operate during the summer recess, June 11 - August 30, 2007, from 7:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m., **Monday through Thursday**. All District operations will be closed on Fridays. There will be no program the week of July 4th. Cost of the program is \$60.00 per week per child. If paid daily, cost is \$15.00 per day. Any child attending for a half day would be charged \$10.00. A half-day is defined as 5 hours or less. The program accepts payments from DHS for Child Care provided DHS approval has been obtained in advance. **All payments are tax deductible.** You do not have to be a Saginaw Public School student or resident to attend.

If you are interested in this program, registration and prepayment are required. Please fill out the form below and bring it to the site on the first day of the program. Payments should be made at the site on the first day of program.

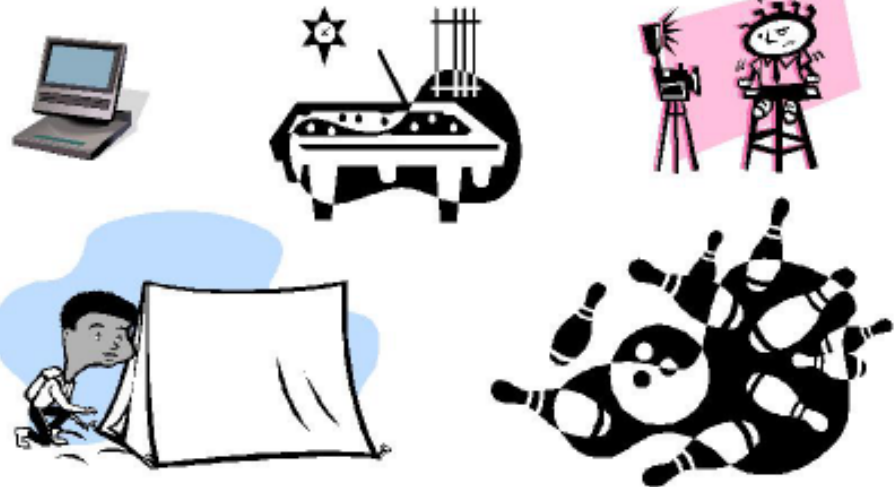

Themed Weekly Sessions:

Session 1: June 11 - June 15 Nature Nuts! Youths will participate in a Bird Watching Project observing winged wildlife around the newly-renovated YMCA facility and at Ojibway Park as they collect research materials to be used at Cornell University. Campers will also visit the Nature Conservatory in Saginaw.

Session 1: June 18 – June 22 Crazy Colors! Do you know your shapes, colors and ABC's? Each day's theme will revolve around a different color.

Session 2: June 25 – June 29 Games Galore! This week will center on different youth participating in different types of games. At the end of the week Youth will create their own games and rules to follow, play and win!

*Children will be in the newly renovated, "Youth-Wing" of the Saginaw YMCA. The Youth Wing services children ages 1-12 and is divided into 3 Components: Childwatch: ages 1-3, Kid's Zone ages 3-6 and Kid's Play 6-12. The entire facility offers age appropriate indoor playgrounds, crafts and daily developmental activities.

YSWIM LESSONS

The YMCA has been called "America's Favorite Swim Instructor" for over 100 years. At the Y, not only will your child learn how to swim, he/she will learn about his/her self, about safety and rescue skills, and about water activities you can enjoy for a lifetime. Throughout all levels, students are taught personal stroke development and safety skills. Also we value and incorporate water sports & games and personal growth to each class. Class size is determined by both safety factors and age of participants and is closely monitored to ensure safety. All our instructors provide caring, personal instruction and all are YMCA Swim Instructor certified. Please read the following descriptions to assist with registration. If you are unsure of what class to register your son or daughter contact Matt Markey 753-7721 ext 215, visit our website www.saginawymca.org, or stop at our Member Service desk for detailed help.

SKIPPERS

Parent/Child (6 - 36 months) 30-minute class designed for children 6 to 36 months and their parents. The primary objective is water adjustment for the child. The parents will be taught how to work with their child and how to keep their child safe in and around the water. Activities are based on the developmental abilities of the child.

Preschool (3 - 5 years) This class is designed for younger children and incorporates water adjustment as well as teaching the basics of swimming, including paddling and kicking. Your child will progress at his or her own pace based on physical ability and the development of hand-eye coordination. The instructors teach the children how to swim on their front and back without the use of a flotation device as well as building their confidence and endurance in the water.

Pike/Eel (Beginner to Advanced Beginner) This class is for children with little or no previous experience. Children will become comfortable in the water and begin to swim independently. At the end of these levels a student will be able to float on the front and back, and swim across our shallow pool without assistance.

Ray/Starfish (Intermediate to Advanced 3-5 year olds) Children review previously learned skills, improve stroke skills, build endurance, learn to tread water and perform basic diving skills. They are introduced to the breaststroke and the sidestroke as well as swim under water and dive. At the end of these levels a student will be able to swim a length of our deep pool on their front and back.

P.S.P. Youth (6 - 14 years)

The progressive lessons are designed for older children and teach the basic strokes as well as proper form and breathing techniques. It allows the beginner the chance to discover how to move effectively in the water and encourages the more advanced swimmers to gain endurance. They will learn all of the basic strokes while having fun in the water.

Polliwog (beginner) Beginner level class for children 6 years and up. In this level children adjusted to the pool, the use of flotation devices, and floating. To pass to the next level they must be able to swim 5-10 ft. on their own.

Polliwog/Guppy (beginner to advanced beginner) In this class children develop basic swimming skills and begin to perform them without the aid of a flotation device. It is for children who are comfortable in the water and can swim independently 5ft or more. To pass to the next level they must swim on their front and back 15ft.

Minnow (intermediate) In this class children learn the crawl with side breathing, backstroke, elementary back, breaststroke, and sidestroke. Basic diving is taught at this level. To pass they must master all skills.

Fish/ Flying Fisk/ Shark (advanced intermediate to advanced) In this class students work to refine all strokes previously learned with turns, increase endurance. They are introduced to the butterfly stroke. Students are also introduced to advanced swim strokes necessary for lifesaving skills. Also, advanced personal safety and rescue skills are introduced. Each of these three levels has different requirements; please see YMCA aquatic staff for details.



We offer 5 different 2-week sessions during the summer. Classes meet the same time each day Monday through Thursday. Simply choose the session and time that best fits your family schedule. Because of the natural succession of our swim lessons program, **no make-up classes** are available.

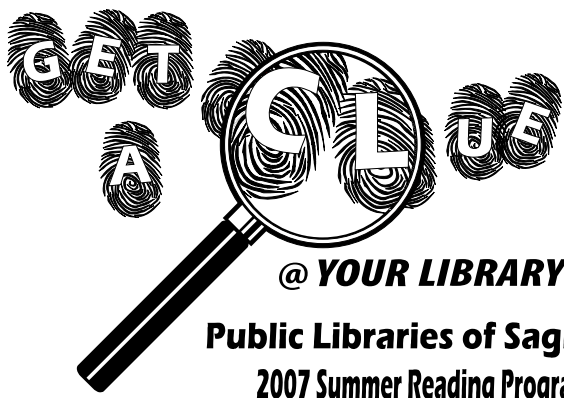
